

Maths

- Practise comparing and ordering fractions as well as adding and subtracting them.
- Properties of 3D shapes and calculating their volume.
- Know fraction, decimal and percentage equivalents.
- Read and interpret information from line graphs.

R.E.

- We will be exploring the concept of myths as well as using trees as symbols.

English

- As we will be learning about crime and punishment in History, we will be exploring the story of Oliver Twist.
- To link with our Geography topic, we will be reading 'Journey to the Centre of the Earth' by Jules Verne.
- We will also be studying persuasion including debates, letters and adverts.

Science

- We will be learning about forces including gravity, friction, air resistance and up-thrust.
- After half term, we will be learning about properties and changes of materials.

History

Our history topic is 'Crime and Punishment Through the Ages'. We will be exploring how crimes and punishment have changed over time and shaped the law and justice system we have today. Year 5 Summer Term Curriculum Overview

Geography

Our focus for geography will be earthquakes and volcanoes. We will be identifying the layers of the Earth and finding out how tectonic plates work. We have planned a trip to the Natural History Museum in June to support this work. More details will follow nearer the time.
